


TYPHOON LAWIN (HAIMA)

Situation Report #1 17 October 2016, Monday, 5pm

Overall Situation

- Typhoon Haima is expected to enter the eastern border of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) this afternoon and will be named locally as "LAWIN."
- US Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JTWC) said Haima is expected to reach a peak of super typhoon intensity by Wednesday morning.
- State weather bureau PAGASA said Haima might be stronger and wider than Typhoon Karen, which left PAR Monday morning.
- PAGASA also said that it may make landfall in northern Luzon.



Emergency Response Efforts

- Alert for Typhoon Haima was sent to the following Regional Centers in Central and Northern Luzon:
 - o Alay Bayan-Luson, Inc. (ABI)
 - o Cagayan Valley Disaster Response Center (CVDRC)
 - o Ilocos Center for Research, Empowerment and Development (ICRED)
 - Cordillera Disaster Response and Development Services (CordisRDS)



- The Regional Centers have alerted their respective areas/communities to prepare or to organize pre-emptive evacuation
- CDRC Emergency Protocol Structure remains operational and is closely monitoring the situation and gathering information from the Regional Centers and other partners
- Volunteers are repacking prepositioned goods at the CDRC warehouse

Resources Available

- Stand-by funds available
- Prepositioned goods available at the CDRC warehouse in Quezon City:
 - o 250 food packs containing:
 - 10 kg rice
 - 1 kg dried fish
 - 6 cans sardines
 - ½ liter cooking oil
 - o Tarpaulin:
 - 60 pcs tarpaulin roof
 - o Sleeping kits:
 - 1,500 pcs mat
 - 1,500 pcs blanket
 - o 100 pcs collapsible water container
 - o 295 pcs bath soap
